Introduction

The Mapping Donor Efforts in the City Assessment collects baseline information of a number of projects working on poverty reduction currently active in Narayanganj with a view to improving coordination between them. The specific objectives are to identify overlaps and gaps, minimize these overlaps, and suggest to Local Government specific actions to ,maximize benefits for the poor, ensure optimum efficiency, and enhance the effectiveness of project and Government resources.

The Assessment is prepared for Local Government and organized in the following way:

- Narayanganj City Priorities and Needs Analysis
- Projects in Narayanganj
- Analysis of Overlaps and Gaps
- Recommendations

Narayanganj City Priorities and Needs Analysis

- The city level priority poverty issues are roads, drains, water supply, solid waste, livelihood, social problems, land tenure, eviction, and housing
- Overall infrastructure conditions are critical in the northern part of the city at Ward no. 4, 5, 6, 10, and 24.
- Water supply condition is critical in all the wards of the northern part of the city at Ward no. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 9, 10, 26, 27.
- Road, drains and water supply conditions are worst at the Ward no. 20.
- Overall livelihood conditions are very low in the most parts of the city meaning that people don't have enough access to employment and income opportunities.
- Housing and land tenure conditions are critical in the north and center of the city at Ward no. 4, 5, 6, 11, 14, 15, and 17.

Analysis of Overlaps and Gaps

Overlaps


- There is overlap in some common areas, which means multiple projects work on the same issue. For example, governance and environment sector got highest priority among the projects and 50% of the projects are working on these two areas.
- City planning is the second highest common area of interests of the projects and 3 projects are working on it.
- Since multiple projects are working in common areas, their delivery may confuse Local Government if there's no coordinated approach for project delivery.

Sectoral Gaps

- Given it is one of the city's priorities, the livelihood sector seems to gets little attention from development partners. The PEEGC Project is the only project contributing to livelihood development of the poor people in Narayanganj City. Although, CGP has few activities, it makes a limited impact because the target of CGP is only 3,000 beneficiaries.
- UPHSCP is the only project that works in health and nutrition sector service delivery which is not sufficient at all considering the number of poor people in the city.
- There are no projects working on housing, land tenure, and eviction, yet it is one of the city's priorities.

Spatial gaps

- Most of the projects do not cover all the wards of the city (except CGP, MGSP and ROSC-II). Projects that have no plans may end up not covering all the areas of the city where poverty is concentrated.
- Two projects (CGP and MGSP) lead infrastructure development activities. Although both
 of these projects are working in all wards of the city, some areas within the wards where
 infrastructure conditions are critical, might be left out.



Recommendations

- Form a Project Coordination Working Group: A Working Group on Project Coordination should be formed under leadership of Narayanganj City Corporation to ensure planned delivery by the projects and get rid of the confusion regarding duplicate deliveries. One member with decision making authority from each of the projects should be the member of the Working Group.
- 2. **Ensure coordination among key sectors:** For the following specific sectors coordination should be established among the relevant projects as mentioned below:

- 3. The City Corporation should build some linkage with UPHSCP to provide free and low-cost health and nutrition services to the extremely poor and poor people of Narayanganj.
- 4. Find ways to promote support for improving Housing and Land Tenure Support: The City Corporation should promote and look for the projects working on Housing and land tenure. The City Corporation should also ensure enabling environment for CHDF to support housing finance for the poor through capacity building of CHDF, providing seed capital for housing finance and linking them with external bodies for managing fund etc
- 5. **Encourage a spatial approach to activities:** The City Corporation should motivate all the current projects to develop a holistic *spatial* plan that covers all wards, and seeks to deliver project benefits to the maximum number of poor beneficiaries.
- 6. **Refer to the City Poverty Reduction Strategy:** The City Poverty Reduction Strategy (also known as the Ward Prioritization)¹ of Narayanganj is a useful guide that identifies the wards with highest concentrations of poverty. It should be used as a tool to identify the Wards where poverty is most highly concentrated and where investments projects would have the biggest impact upon reducing poverty in the city
- 7. **Improve Health and Nutrition for the Poor: N**arayanganj City Corporation should persuade UPHSCP to provide easy-to-access and low-cost health and nutrition services to the poor people.

¹ Poverty Reduction Strategy (Ward Prioritization) of Narayanganj has been prepared in 2017 using the citywide poverty mapping data to be used as a strategic tool for decision making related to poverty reduction






